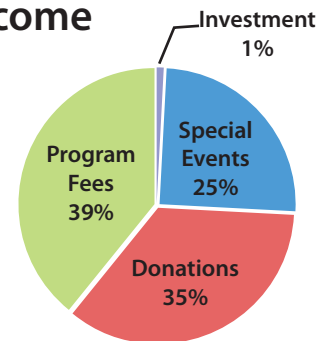

In 2010, the cost to operate the facility for 1 day = \$551

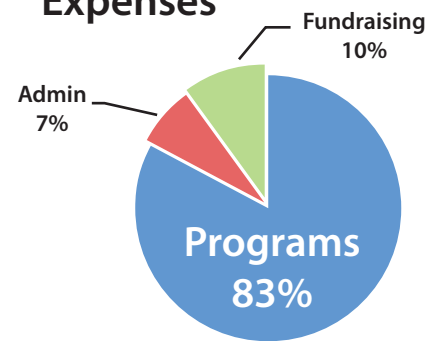
83 cents of every dollar was spent on therapeutic riding programs

Riverwood served an average of 90 students per week. Riverwood subsidizes approximately 70% of the cost of riding lessons for all participants; beyond that, Riverwood gave \$3,591 in scholarships to those who could not afford the fees.
